## College and Career Readiness <u>Reading and Writing</u> Anchor Standards # 8 for Literacy in History/Social Studies, Science, and Technical Subjects Standards

## Strand Section: Integration of Knowledge and Ideas

<u>NOTE:</u> Disciplinary literacy standards are only presented separately in grades 6-12. Literacy standards for K–5 reading in history/social studies, science, and technical subjects are integrated into the K–5 Reading standards.

Skills and concepts for end-of-year, grade specific expectations for a given standard are reinforced and expanded as students advance through the grades. The standards increase in complexity and sophistication as new skills and concepts are added to each grade level from the previous year. The grades 6–12 standards are divided into two sections, one for ELA and the other for history/social studies, science, and technical subjects. This division reflects the critical combined role that both the English Language Arts and Content Area teachers play in developing students' literacy skills. The grade level pathway disciplinary literacy standards for both reading and writing are presented below. For the complete sets of standards, see <u>ELA CCSS</u>.
